laptops or computers that we use today, where you can do all sorts of things on laptops: search things, watch things and even send messages! However the type writers you could only type and then print. They were invented by:


Christopher Latham Sholes, Frank Haven Hall, Carlos Glidden and Samuel W. Soule.
