



Hi my name is Charlotte and I am here to talk about wildlife. The big question is today should we give up half our planet to wildlife.

Here is a bit about wildlife. More than 3300 species of mammals including Javan leopards and vaquita porpoises are in danger of becoming extinct according to research this year. In August 2018, I went to Belgium and France for a holiday with my family. We started our trip in Belgium, where we visited a World War 1 battlefield, some trenches, and Tyne Cot War cemetery which is the largest Commonwealth War Graves Commission cemetery in the world. It is the resting place of more than 11,900 servicemen of the British Empire from the First World War.

We also visited the Menin Gate Memorial. The names of more than 54,000 soldiers who died, and have no known grave, are engraved on the walls.

Since 1928, the Last Post has been played every evening at 8pm under the memorial. We were there on one of those evenings in August.

We then went to France and visited the Pointe du Hoc Monument which is on a cliff near Normandy. We walked to this monument and it overlooks Omaha Beach. It was built by the French to honour American soldiers who came in on the beaches on 6th June 1944. These soldiers climbed up the 100 foot cliffs to seize the German guns.

We then visited the Normandy American Cemetery, which contains the graves of 9,380 soldiers. While we were there, we saw the American flag being raised on the flag pole and there was a 1 minute silence, before the flag was lowered and carried away.

We all thought it was very interesting and if you have never been to any of these places, then I would highly recommend it.

Good afternoon, today I am going to be telling you about the Holocaust and about Adolf Hitler, the leader of the Nazis, which basically means – National, Socialist, German, Workers Party or, as many would say, NSGWP. I will also be telling you about the kinder transport and a young girl whose death is most famous.

First, I will be telling you about a young girl's diary: her name is Anne Frank. Anne Frank is best known for her diary 'Kitty'. Anne lived with her mother Edith, her father Otto and her sister Margot. Anne's diary begins on the 12th June (her Birthday 1942.) Over the next 2 years, she vividly describes her life. Anne went to a normal school where she was a bit too talkative.

One day, her parents received a call up for labour camp. It was for Margot. Otto Frank managed a warehouse and his most trusted workers were secretly moving furniture into an annexe, a small, secret room. Because of the call up, they moved in, 10 days before Margot was due to go. There was another family who they shared the annexe with, whom she code named 'The Van Danns.' Not long after, a man named Fritz moved in and shared a room with Anne; his code name was Albert Dussle. Her diary ends abruptly when she and 7 other people were discovered by the Nazis. Anne and Margot both unfortunately died in Bergen Belsem near Hanover. Otto Frank was the only one who survived the camps and devoted himself to spreading the word of his daughter's diary.

I shall now tell you about the 10 thousand Jewish children saved via the Kinder transport. During the Kinder transport, the Jewish children were sent to families in England who were willing to adopt them, by the allied troops. Although you may think this was kind of the Nazis, the conditions were terrible. The children were separated from their families, all given numbers and crammed into a very small carriage. This happened 9 months prior to the war. There is a statue of some Jewish children outside Liverpool Street Station in central London.

It is terrible how people treated the Jews but it is always going to be a part of history, so we should try to learn from it. What you will be hearing about next is about Concentration camps and about Adolf Hitler.

Adolf Hitler first came to power in 1930 and he hated Jews. He forced all Jews to sew golden stars to their clothes so they could be identified. They were banned from public places like parks and theatres. After a few years he came up with a final solution; to kill all the Jews! He sent all Jews to concentration camps, with lots of other people he disliked such as gay people and disabled people. Those in good condition were put to work. Those who were not were killed. He came up with some horrible death such as gas chambers and death marches. At around 1945 camps started to be liberated by allied forces! This was the end of the Holocaust.

To this day we still remember the Holocaust and will never forget what happened to all those innocent Jews. We should try to prevent this from happening ever again, to anyone because we now know the terrible consequences. Thank you!

The Irish Civil War

Good afternoon, today I am here to tell you about the history of the Irish Civil War which occurred in 1922. The purpose of my speech is to inform you about the historical facts that happened during this war.

After the British Empire left Ireland, a detrimental civil war broke out between two sides –Irish Republicans and Irish Nationalists. The Provisional Government supported an Anglo-Irish treaty and soon they became a free state in December 1922. But the Irish Republicans believed that it was betrayal of the Irish Republic and so they went to war.

Many of those who fought on both sides of conflict had been members of the IRA (Irish Republican Army) during the War of Independence (against the British when they took over). This left the Irish society divided and embittered for generations. Even today, two political parties in the Republic of Ireland are direct descendants of the two main sides of the civil war.

The Anglo-Irish treaty, which the Provisional Government supported, was agreed to end the 1919 Irish War of Independence. It provided for a self-governing Irish state having its own army and police force. The treaty also allowed Northern Ireland to decide whether to stay in the new state of their country or return to the United Kingdom. Soon the parliament of the Irish Republic narrowly passed the Anglo-Irish treaty's agreement, the British recognised that the Provisional Government of the IFS (Irish Free State) was established and Northern Ireland remained within the United Kingdom.

After the war finished in 1923 (one year later) the two sides split and they didn't fight anymore. Still today Northern Ireland has remained in the UK because of the Irish Nationalists before the war.
